or interest be at any time past due and unpaid; then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due at the option of the holder hereof, who
may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for an attorney's fee of

bargain, sell and release unto the said Farmers Bank, of Belton S.C., its successors

and assigns forever, all that certain tract of land
situate, lying and being in Dunklin Township, State
and County aforesaid, containing two hundred Acres
more or less, (less three to five acres, sold to my
daughter in law, Mrs. J. W. Holliday) adjoining
lands of E. H. Acker estate, J. J. Cothran, J. L.
Cothran and Saluda River the same being known
as the "Vaughn Tract of Land" and was deeded
to me by J. J. Vaughn, et al, October 28th, 1901
said deed is recorded in the office of R. M. C.
for Greenville County in book H. H. H. page 316, also
all that tract of land situate, lying and being
in Dunklin Township, State and County aforesaid,
containing seventy four acres, more or
less, adjoining lands of estate of E. H. Acker,
J. J. Cothran, E. S. Cothran, estate of E. H. Holliday,
et al, being the "Home Place" where I now live.
