WHEREAS, I, Helen H. Clarke, in my capacity as Trustee, do hereby acknowledge and declare that I am well and truly indebted to A. P. Southerlin,

in the full and just sum of \$600.00 (Six hundred dollars),

Dollars, to be paid five years after date, with the privilege of the mortgagor to pay any or all of said sum at any time during said period,

with interest thereon from the 18th day of April, 1928, at the rate of 7 per cent. per annum to be computed and paid,

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of ten per cent.

at and before the signing of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bar-

gain, sell and release unto the said A. P. Southerlin, his heirs and assigns, all that piece, parcel or lot of land situate in Cleveland Township, County and State aforesaid, located on West side of the Jones Gap Road, adjoining lands of the Estate of Mrs. Fannie Beattie and A. P. Southerlin, and being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at an iron pin on the Jones Gap Road and running thence S. 38 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 56.89 chains to a pine; thence N. 58 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 4.80 chains to an iron pin; thence N. 50 E. 23 chains and 57 links to stone; thence S. 49 E. 4.65 chains to an iron pin in old road; thence N. 28 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. with said old road 5.41 chains to an iron pin in said road; thence N. 44 E. 3.17 chains to an iron pin (old corner - Maple gone); thence N. 45 $\frac{1}{4}$ E. 7.54 chains to stone O. M.; thence N. 48 $\frac{1}{4}$ E. 4 chains to stone, O. M.; thence N. 21 E. 6.38 chains to center of Jones Gap Road; thence S. 83 E. along said road 12 chains and 50 links to bend in road; thence S. 45 E. 5 chains and 32 links to the point of beginning, and containing forty-five (45) acres, more or less, according to survey and plat of W. A. Hester, Surveyor, made February 9th, 1928. This being the same tract of land conveyed to me this day by the said A. P. Southerlin and this mortgage is given to secure the balance of the purchase money thereof.
