WHEREAS, I, the said William A Finlay

Dollars, to be paid one year from date

with interest thereon, from date secured is paid in  
computed and paid annuity of \$12.00 per day at the rate of 8 per cent. per annum to be

until paid in full, all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or  
interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may  
sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee  
ten per cent of amount due besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be  
added to the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part  
thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference being  
thereunto had, as will more fully appear.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That I, the said William A Finlay  
in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said  
H. C. Wood

according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to me  
William A Finlay  
in hand well and truly paid by the said H. C. Wood

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bar-  
gain, sell and release unto the said H. C. Wood, his heirs and assigns, all that

tract of land situate in the County of Greenville, South Carolina  
and known and designated as Tract no. 2 of the Lighton  
Goodwin Land as shown by plat made by J. N. Southern  
according to survey of May 10th, 1903, said land being more  
particularly described as follows: Beginning at a  
point in the bridge over the center of the creek  
where the Buncombe Road crosses said creek and  
runs up the right fork of said creek as a line to a  
willow at mouth of a branch 37N; thence continuing  
up the branch or creek as a line 32.50 to a stone 37; thence  
N. 84 1/2 E. 3.35 to a stone 370; thence S. 52 E. 8.50 to a large water  
oak 370; thence N. 20 E. 21.00 to a stone 370; thence 34 1/2 W.  
5.20 to a stone 370; thence N 20 1/4 E. 3.00 to an iron pin in  
road; thence N 74 3/4 W. 2.56 to stone 370; thence N. 53 1/2 W. to  
a stone; thence N 61 E. 1.10 to a stone 37N on the old line;  
thence along the road as a line 33.14 to stake 37N on  
bridge over a branch; thence up the branch as a line  
6.50 to a sweet gum 37N head of branch; thence N 36 1/2  
W. 5.00 to a red oak 37N; thence S. 43 1/4 W. 2.92 to a stone  
37N. thence N. 82 W. 6.00 to a B. O. 37N; thence 46 1/4 W.  
9.57 to a dogwood 37N; thence N 67 W. 4.00 to a chestnut  
tree 37N; thence S. 47 1/2 W. 5.40 to a stone 37N;  
thence S. 79 W. 4.50 to a stone 37N in the branch;  
thence up said branch 7.57 to a stake in creek or  
branch; thence S. 69 3/4 W. 82 links to a locust post  
thence S. 4 W. 14.70 to a stone 370; thence to a stake  
37 on the Buncombe Road on the old line; thence  
along said Road as a line to the beginning corner.
