All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville and in Oak Lawn Township, containing $84\frac{3}{4}$ acres, more or less, and designated and described on a certain plat made by Wm. F. Lee, Surveyor, February 3, 1898, for J. H. Woodside, said tract of land having the following metes and bounds according to said plat, to wit: Beginning at a stone 43 on creek, thence with the creek as a line in a northwesterly direction 26.50 chains to a stone 43; thence north $41\frac{3}{4}$ deg. west sixteen chains to a stone 43 in branch; thence in a northeasterly direction along said branch as a line 44 chains to a stone 43; thence south $1\frac{1}{4}$ deg. west 24.45 chains to a R.O. 43; thence south $65\frac{3}{4}$ deg. east 10 chains to a stone 43; thence south $1\frac{3}{4}$ deg. west 16.50 chains to a stone 43; thence south $3\frac{1}{4}$ deg. west 13 chains to a creek, the point of beginning. This is the same tract of land heretofore conveyed to John H. Woodside by deed of Jos. H. Woodside dated October 18, 1924, recorded in R. M. C. office, reference to which is hereby expressly made.

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land lying, situate and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, and in Oak Lawn Township, known as "The Old Woodside Plantation" containing two hundred twenty-one and three-fifths ($221\frac{3}{5}$) acres, more or less, and being lots numbered one (1) two (2), three (3), four (4), five (5) and six (6), as shown on a plat of the survey of the lands of which J.
