TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS MAY CONCERN:

WHEREAS, *I* the said *Lenaora B. Hasselwood* SEND GREETING:
Hasselwood and *Lenaora B. Hasselwood, and Lewis H. Hasselwood*

in and by *our* certain Note or obligation bearing even date herewith, stand indebted unto THE PRUDENTIAL INSURANCE COMPANY OF AMERICA in the full and just principal sum of *Thirty-eight Hundred and no/100* Dollars (\$*3,800.00*) to be paid in *years* from date, at the dates and in the amounts as follows, namely:

with interest thereon from date hereof, at the rate set forth in said note, the principal of said note together with interest being due and payable in monthly instalments as follows:

Beginning on the first day of October, 1938, and on the first day of each month thereafter the sum of Twenty-five and 08/100 (\$25.08) Dollars and the balance of said principal sum due and payable on the first day of September, 1958. The aforesaid monthly payments of Twenty-five and 08/100 (\$25.08) Dollars each are to be applied first to interest at the rate set forth in said note on the principal sum of Thirty-eight Hundred and no/100 (\$3,800.00) Dollars, or so much as shall from time to time remain unpaid, and the balance of each monthly instalment shall be applied on account of principal.

Said note provides that past due principal and/or interest shall bear interest at the rate of seven per cent, per annum, as reference being had to said note will more fully appear, default in any payment of either principal or interest to render the whole debt due at the option of the Mortgagee.

NOW KNOW ALL MEN, that, *I* the said *Lenaora B. Hasselwood* in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said THE PRUDENTIAL INSURANCE COMPANY OF AMERICA, according to the terms of the said note; and also in consideration of the further sum of *THREE* DOLLARS, to *me* the said *Lenaora B. Hasselwood* in hand well and truly paid by the said THE PRUDENTIAL INSURANCE COMPANY OF AMERICA at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said THE PRUDENTIAL INSURANCE COMPANY OF AMERICA the following described real estate, to-wit:

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land with the buildings and improvements thereon situated, lying and being on the West side of Milton Street in the City of Greenville, County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, known and designated as part of Lots 28 and 30 of Section B, on plat of Stone Land Company recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, South Carolina, in Plat Book A, at pages 337-345, and having, according to survey made by R. E. Dalton, Engineer, August 18, 1938, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at a concrete post on the West side of Milton Street, said post being 70 feet north from the Northwest corner of intersection of West Croft Street and Milton Street and running thence N. 83°-17' 21. 148 feet to a stake; thence N. 1°-41' E. 70 feet to a stake; thence S. 83°-17' E. 148 feet to an iron pin on the West side of Milton Street; thence with the West side of Milton Street S. 1°-41' 21. 70 feet to the beginning corner.

This is the identical property conveyed to the mortgagor herein by deed of M. P. Meyers dated September 3rd, 1938, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, South Carolina, in Deeds Volume 205, page 356.

The debt secured by the within mortgage has been paid and satisfied in full and the same is hereby canceled.
