I know All Men By These Presents; that for and in consideration of the sum of Eleven Hundred -- (1100.00) Dollars, receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, The Federal Land Bank of Columbia, the owner and the holder of the mortgage herein after referred to and of the note thereby secured, does hereby, subject to the conditions hereinafter stated, release and forever discharge from the lien of that certain mortgage from Robert Altou Ford -- to the Federal Land Bank of Columbia, securing the payment of the principal sum of Fourteen Hundred (\$1400.00) Dollars, dated the 29 day of November, 1933, and recorded in the office of the C.C.C.P. & G.S. and or A.M.C. for Greenville, County, State of South Carolina, in Mortgage Book 249, at page 11, the property hereinafter described; and that for and in consideration of the sum of One (1.00) Dollars, receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, Federal Farm Mortgage Corporation, the owner and holder of the mortgage hereinafter referred to and of the note thereby secured pursuant to the act of Congress known as Federal Farm Mortgage Corporation Act approved January 31, 1934, by and through the Federal Land Bank of Columbia, as its agent and Attorney in fact pursuant to the Act of Congress known as Farm Credit Act of 1935 approved June 3, 1935; does hereby, subject to the conditions hereinafter stated, release and forever discharge from the lien of that certain mortgage executed and delivered by Robert Altou Ford, to the Land Bank Commissioner, dated the 29 day of November, 1933, and recorded in the office of the C.C.C.P. & G.S. and or A.M.C. for Greenville County, State of South Carolina, in Mortgage Book 247, at page 66, the property hereinafter described to-wit:
