all that tract or lot of land in J. W. Norwood's Mountain Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina.

On the side of Looper's Creek, waters of Saluda River and bounded by lands now or formerly of Jones Edwards, J. J. Blakley, Hodgins and others, and being the same tract of land conveyed to J. L. Garlington Jr. and A. E. Garlington by E. Luman Master, by deed dated December 14, 1914, and recorded in the office of R. M. Co. for Greenville County, in Vol. 14 Page 456. Said tract containing 16 1/2 acres more or less. Also that certain tract of land situate in the county and State aforesaid on White Horse Road containing 3 1/2 acres, more or less, bounded on the west by lands of J. J. Ward and B. M. Gibson, on the North by M. J. Tyson, on the east by F. M. E. Martin, on the South by George W. Hawkins being formerly the home place of J. W. Berry and being the same tract of land conveyed to J. L. Garlington Jr. by J. W. Berry by deed dated Dec. 11, 1906, recorded in said office in Vol. 1555 at Page 262. Saving and excepting, however, All that certain tract of land containing seven acres, more or less, conveyed by J. W. Norwood to Mamie L. Trammell by deed of December 30, 1931 and therein described as follows: Beginning at an iron stake (railroad iron) on the White Horse Road at corner of land of F. M. E. Martin, running thence 8 3/4 east 7.41 to an iron stake, (railroad iron), at said Martin's corner, thence south 24 1/2 West, 17.6, along Martin's line to an old corner (rock) at corner of said Martin and Hawkins, thence South 86. West to a new rock on Cedar Lane Road, Hawkins corner, thence North 1 1/2 East, 16.79 to the beginning corner.
