KNOWN ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That

Thomas T. Thompson,

County and State aforesaid, hereinafter called first party, whether one or more, SEND GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, first party is indebted to The Federal Land Bank of Columbia, a corporation created, organized and existing under and by virtue of an Act of Congress, entitled the Federal Farm Loan Act, hereinafter called second party, as evidenced by a certain promissory note, of even date herewith, for the principal sum of Fourteen Hundred and no/100 (\$1400.00) Dollars,

payable to the order of the second party, together with interest from the date of said note on the principal sum remaining from time to time unpaid, at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, (or at the rate of interest fixed by Act of Congress),

first payment on interest being due and payable on the first day of November, 1934, 19...

and thereafter interest being due and payable annually; said principal sum being due and payable in Twenty (20) equal, successive, annual installments

of Seventy and no/100 (\$70.00) Dollars, the first installment of said principal being due

and payable on the first day of November 1935, 19...

and thereafter the remaining installments of principal being due and payable annually until the entire principal sum and interest are paid in full, and each installment of principal and interest bearing interest from due date until paid at the highest rate authorized to be charged under the Federal Farm Loan Act, as amended; all of which and such other terms, conditions, and agreements as are contained in the said note, will more fully appear by reference thereto.

Thompson homeplace, in Butler Township, of Greenville County, State of South Carolina, located on the Anderson Bridge Road, nine miles Southwest from Beer, on waters of Enoree River, and now in the possession of the said T. Watson and Bud Ford; on the East by lands of Elford Thompson; on the South by the Watson land and the lands of the Tom Anderson Estate; and on the West by lands of Claude Neeley Estate and J. E.
