with interest thereon, from date at the rate of 7 per cent. per annum to be
computed and paid quarterly

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of
principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder
hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for an attorney's fee of \$25.00

besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be
added to the amount due on the said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or
any part thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference being thereunto had, will more fully appear.

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents do
grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said E. B. Nash, his heirs and assigns.

One of the City of Greenville, fronting 57 feet on Pine Street, and extending to rear
about 85 feet to lot formerly owned by Mrs. Elizabeth Love, on the East adjoining lot
formally owned by Stephen King, and separated by a fence from said lot by a fence now
on dividing line, and on West by a adjoining lot formerrally owned by Patrick Tusker,
and containing 5,200 square feet more or less, being the same lot conveyed to Rosa
