all that tract or lot of land in Cleveland Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina.

containing four acres, more or less, on the waters of South Saluda River, lying on both sides of Geer Highway about seven miles from the summit of Caesar's Head, bounded by land of Mountain Lake Colony and Oliver W. Hardin, being more fully and particularly described in a deed from Oliver W. Hardin and Sallie S. Hardin to me bearing date of September 19, 1924, recorded in deed book 102, page 216, and in a deed from Rachel Bagwell to me bearing date of August \_\_, 1935, recorded in deed book 196, page 210, R. M. C. Office for said Greenville County. This is the property known as the Wild Cat Filling Station. Less, however, 1.37 acres conveyed by me to Henry G. Crooks. ALSO all that strip, piece, parcel or lot of land situated on State Route 183, Project FSA 48 A., Greenville County, South Carolina, having the following measurements and boundaries, beginning at an iron pin on the property line between R. L. Townsend and Mountain Lake Colonies, Inc., 60 feet from the centerline of Route 193 and extending down this right of way line in a Westerly direction for 50 feet to an iron pin that is 60 feet from the center line of Route 183, thence from this point extending in an Southerly direction for 78 feet to an iron pin, thence from this point extending in an Easterly direction for 50 feet to an iron pin (on the property line between Mountain Lake Colonies, Inc., and the Oliver Harden Estate), thence from this point extending in a Northerly direction for 75 feet to an iron pin, the beginning point, property being bounded on the North by a 60 foot right of way line of State Route 183, on the West by lands of Mountain Lake Colonies, Inc., on the South by lands of Mountain Lake Colonies, Inc., and on the East by lands of the Oliver Harden Estate and lands of R. L. Townsend. This being the same property conveyed to me by Mountain Lake Colonies, Inc., by deed dated January 26, 1940, recorded in the office of R. M. C. for Greenville County in deed book 218 at page 143. "
