having according to an old survey the following metes and bounds, as described by deed from Lawrence B. Garrison to W. R. Payne, dated March 16, 1901, recorded in Deed Book GGG, page 818, R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, having the following metes and bounds, to wit:

BEGINNING at a large poplar 3x on the branch; thence down the branch as line, 32 chains to a beech 3 xo; thence S. 16 1/2 W. 12.50 to a stone 3xo; thence S. 5 W. 11.45 to a stake 3xo; thence S. 5.93 to B. O. stump 3xo; thence S. 44 1/2 E. 8.29 to P. O. 3xo; thence N. 55 1/2 E. 23.00 to the beginning corner.
