with all of the buildings and improvements thereon, being known and designated as Lots Nos. 22, 23, 24 and 25 of the plat of Paris-Piney Park made by C. M. Furman, Jr., Engineer, June, 1926, recorded in the office of the R. M. C. for the County and State aforesaid in plat book H at pages 19 and 20, and according to said plat being described as follows:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the north side of Apotka Avenue, joint front corner of lots 21 and 22, and running thence with the joint line of said lots 215 feet to a point on the south side of Piney Mountain Road; thence with said Road in a southeasterly direction 201.3 feet to the joint rear corner of lots 25 and 26; thence with the joint line of said lots 198 feet to iron pin on Apotka Ave.; thence with the north side of Apotka Ave., 200 feet to the beginning corner.

ALSO those certain other lots on the south side of Apotka Avenue, being known and designated as lots 38, 38, 40 and 41 of said plat and being described as follows:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the south side of Apotka Avenue at joint corner of lots 37 and 38, and running thence along the south side of Apotka Ave., 200 feet to an iron pin at joint corner of lots 41 and 42; thence with the joint line of said lots in a southwesterly direction, 150 feet to an iron pin at joint rear corner of lots 41 and 42, 61 and 62; thence along the rear line of lots 41 and 42, 38 and 39, 200 feet to an iron pin at rear corner of lots 37, 38, 57 and 58; thence with joint line of lots 37 and 38, 150 feet in a northeasterly direction to the south side of Apotka Ave., the beginning corner.
