BEGINNING at a maple at the spring ( and including the spring) thence running North to a P.O., thence South to the public road; thence West to a Pine on the bank of the New Public Road, which leads from Trammell's to a bridge at branch; thence with said Road to a bridge; thence back to the beginning corner.

The above described appearing to be indefinite, a survey was made and the above land included according to said survey, the following description:

BEGINNING on a bridge at the fork of branch; thence running up branch S. 68½ W. 69 links in branch; thence N. 72 W. 97 links to an iron pin; thence N. 38¼ W. 2 -22/100 chains to an iron pin in an old abandoned road; thence with said road N. 45½ W. 2.82 chains to a bend; thence N. 38 W. 3.72 chains to a bend; thence N. 16 W. 4.23 chains to a bend in road; thence N. 33 W. 4.45 chains to a bend; thence N. 36 W. 5.26 chains to an iron pin in new road; thence N. 55 W. 2.68 chains to a bend in new road; thence N. 59 W. 2.24 chains to a bend; thence N. 75 W. 3.12 chains to a Pine on bank of road; thence N. 83 E. 14.75 chains to a P.O. x3 old mark; thence S. 15 E. 8.80 chains to a maple on branch near spring; thence down the meanders of the branch 22 chains to the beginning corner, and containing 14-¾ acres, more or less.
