containing 68 acres, more or less about 8 miles South from Greenville Court House, on Highway No. 25, called the New Augusta Road which around the air base, title to which was derived by me as follows: One Tract of 64 acres was devised to me by my father Wm. Stenhouse whose will is on file in the Probate Court for Greenville County; and one tract containing 166 acres, which afterwards surveyed was found to be a few acres more, by the will of my aunt Jeanette S. Cunningham, my two sisters, Elizabeth Stenhouse and Ina Jean S. Piehoff conveyed their interest to me in said tract by deed dated November 28, 1942, recorded in the R.M.C. Office for said Greenville County, in Deed Book 249, page 217, and reference to said deed for a more full description is hereby craved.

This is the remainder of the land I now own which is hereby mortgaged less a number of tracts I have conveyed as shown by the recorded deeds in the R.M.C. Office for said Greenville County. This mortgage is in addition to the amount I now owe to said R. L. Brownlee and is for a new loan, the present consideration being for \$1000.00 cash advanced to me.
