

MORTGAGE OF REAL ESTATE—GREM 7a.

(and such other casualties and contingencies)

AND the said Mortgagor... further covenant... Sand agree... to keep the buildings on said premises constantly insured for the benefit of the Mortgagee, against loss by fire and tornado...

pledged to the Mortgagee and deliver renewals thereof to the said... Mortgagee... his heirs, executors, administrators, successors or assigns, shall for any reason fail to keep the said premises so insured or fail to deliver the policies of insurance to the said Mortgagee...

AND should the Mortgagee, by reason of any such insurance against loss by fire or tornado as aforesaid, receive any sum or sums of money for any damage by fire or tornado to the said building or buildings, such amount may be retained and applied by it toward payment of the amount hereby secured; or the same may be paid over, either wholly or in part, to the said Mortgagee...

AND it is further covenanted and agreed that in the event of the passage, after the date of this mortgage, of any law of the State of South Carolina deducting from the value of land, for the purpose of taxation any lien thereon, or changing in any way the laws now in force for the taxation of mortgages or debts secured by mortgage for State or local purposes, or the manner of the collection of any such taxes, so as to affect this mortgage, the whole of the principal sum secured by this mortgage, together with the interest due thereon, shall, at the option of the said Mortgagee, without notice to the contrary notwithstanding.

AND it is further covenanted and agreed that the mailing of a written notice and demand by depositing it in any post-office, station, or letter-box, enclosed in a postpaid envelope addressed to the owner of record of said mortgaged premises, and directed to said owner at the last address actually furnished to the holder of this mortgage, or in default thereof, directed to said owner at said mortgaged premises, shall be sufficient notice and demand in any case arising under this instrument, and required by the provisions thereof or the requirements of the law.

AND it is further covenanted and agreed by said parties that in default of the payment by said Mortgagor... of all or any taxes, charges and assessments which may be imposed by law upon the said... mortgaged premises or any part thereof, it shall and may be lawful for the said Mortgagee, its successors, legal representatives, and assigns, to pay the amount of any such tax, charge or assessment with any expenses attending the same; and any amounts so paid, the Mortgagor... shall repay to the said Mortgagee, its... successors, legal representatives or assigns, on demand, with interest thereon, and the same shall be a lien on the said premises and be secured by the said bond and by these presents; and the whole amount hereby secured, if not then due, shall thereupon, if the said Mortgagee so elects, become due and payable forthwith. And the said Mortgagor... do es further covenant and agree that he will execute or procure any further necessary assurance of the title to said premises and will forever warrant said title.
