

This Mortgage secures a loan guaranteed under Section (501)(505) of the Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944, as amended, and Regulations issued under the Act and in effect on the date that this loan is submitted and accepted or approved for guaranty shall govern the rights, duties and liabilities of the parties to such loan, and any provisions of the loan instruments inconsistent with such Regulations are hereby amended and supplemented to conform thereto. Should the Veterans' Administration fail or refuse to issue its guaranty of the loan secured by this mortgage under the provisions of the Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944, as amended, in the amount of \$900.00, within sixty days from the date the loan would normally become eligible for such guaranty, the mortgagee herein may, at its option, declare all sums secured by this mortgage immediately due and payable.

It is agreed between the parties hereto that if the mortgagor does not maintain the premises in reasonable repair the mortgagee may do so and may add to the indebtedness any reasonable expense necessary and proper for the maintenance or repair of the security.

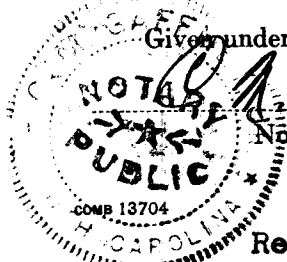
