"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or to be constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, and in Butler Township, on the Northwest side of Brookdale avenue, and being known and designated as the Northern half of Lot No. 9, of Block I, and the Southern 40 feet of Lot No. 8, of Block I, of a subdivision known as "Fair Heights", as shown on plat thereof recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Plat Book F, at page 257, and having, according to a recent survey made by J. C. Hill, Surveyor, on April 15, 1948, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:
