Dollars (\$ 1,500.00), with interest from date at the rate of four per centum (4 %) per annum until paid, said principal and interest being payable at the office of The Peoples National Bank of Greenville, South Carolina in Greenville, South Carolina, or at such other place as the holder of the note may designate in writing delivered or mailed to the Mortgagor, in monthly installments of Nine and 09/100

Dollars (\$ 9.09), commencing on the first day of January, 19 49 and continuing on the first day of each month thereafter until the principal and interest are fully paid, except that the final payment of principal and interest, if not sooner paid, shall be due and payable on the first day of December, 19 68

Now, KNOW ALL MEN, that Mortgagor, in consideration of the aforesaid debt and for better securing the payment thereof to the Mortgagee, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars (\$3) to the Mortgagor in hand thereof and truly paid by the Mortgagee at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold, assigned, and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell, assign, and release unto the Mortgagee, its successors and assigns, the following-described property situated in the county of Greenville, Gantt Township, State of South Carolina; being known and designated as Lot No. 47, according to

plat of property of Woodfields, Inc., a subdivision located on the south-west side of the Augusta Road, said lot having, the following metes and bounds, according to plat by Dalton & Neves, Engineers, recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book S, Page 113:

Beginning at an iron pin on the northern side of Crestfield Road at the joint front corner of Lots 48 and 47 and running thence along the line of Lot 48 N. 38-23 W. 189.7 feet to an iron pin at the rear of Lot 48; thence along the rear lines of Lots 44 and 45 S. 88-07 E. 104.9 feet to an iron pin at the rear corner of Lot 46; thence along the line of Lot 46 S. 38-23 E. 119 feet to an iron pin on Crestfield Road; thence along Crestfield Road S. 51-37 W. 80 feet to the point of beginning.
