BEGINNING on iron pin in center of road leading from town of Renfrew west into White Horse Road; thence N. 73 W. 2.48 chains to iron pin on line of Mrs. Lillie Wade; thence N. 25 3/4 E. 1.25 chains to iron pin on Miss Lillie Hodgens line; thence S. 66 E. 2.30 chains to iron pin on Miss Lillie Hodgens line; thence S. 20 3/4 W. .97 of a chain to iron pin in center of above named or described road, adjoining lands of Mrs. Lillie Wade and Miss Lillie Hodgens, and containing (.25) twenty-five hundredths of an acre, more or less, according to survey made by J.
