"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or to be constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in Chick Springs Township, School District 9-C, being known and designated as Lot No. 19 of the property of H. G. Stevens, according to a plat thereof prepared by W. J. Riddle, Surveyor, April 1941 and recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Plat Book M, at page 9, and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:
