porated herein by reference, in the principal sum of Fifty-Five Hundred and No/100 - - - - -

Dollars (\$ 5500.00 ), with interest from date at the rate of  
Four - - - - - per centum ( 4 % ) per annum until paid, said principal and interest being payable  
at the office of Canal Insurance Company

in Greenville, S.C., or at such other place as the holder of the note may  
designate in writing delivered or mailed to the Mortgagor, in monthly installments of Thirty-Three and 33/100

Dollars (\$ 33.33 ), commencing on the first day of  
August, 19 50, and continuing on the first day of each month thereafter until the principal and  
interest are fully paid, except that the final payment of principal and interest, if not sooner paid, shall be due and  
payable on the first day of July, 19 70

Now, Know ALL MEN, that Mortgagor, in consideration of the aforesaid debt and for better securing the  
payment thereof to the Mortgagee, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars (\$3) to the Mortgagor  
in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagee at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt  
whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold, assigned, and released, and by these presents does  
grant, bargain, sell, assign, and release unto the Mortgagee, its successors and assigns, the following-described  
property situated in the county of Greenville

State of South Carolina; on the East side of Essex Court, in the City of Greenville,  
and being shown as lot No. 33 on a plat of Essex Court made by Dalton & Neves in  
May 1949, recorded in Plat Book W at Page 31, and described as follows:

BEGINNING at a stake on the East side of Essex Court 255 feet North  
from a County Road at corner of lot 34, and running thence with the line of said  
lot, N. 86-15 E. 128 feet to a stake; thence N. 5-52 W. 60.04 feet to a stake at  
corner of lot 32; thence with the line of said lot, S. 86-15 W. 125.7 feet to a  
stake on Essex Court; thence with the Eastern side of Essex Court, S. 3-45 E. 60  
feet to the beginning corner.

Being the same premises conveyed to the mortgagor by Central Development  
Corporation by deed to be recorded.
