Whereas Selma W. Coleman, L. Elizabeth Coleman and Mozelle C. Kennedy

is justly indebted to C. Douglas Wilson & Co., a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of South Carolina, hereinafter spoken of as the Mortgagee, in the sum of Twenty-three Hundred and No/100 - - - - - Dollars

(\$ 2300.00 - - - - -), lawful money of the United States which shall be legal tender in payment of all debts and dues, public and private, at the time of payment, secured to be paid by that one certain bond or obligation, bearing even date herewith, conditioned for payment at the principal office of the said C. Douglas Wilson & Co., in the City of Greenville, S. C., or at such other place either within or without the State of South Carolina, as the owner of this obligation may from time to time designate, of the sum of

Twenty-three Hundred and No/100 - - - - - Dollars (\$ 2300.00 - - - - -)

with interest thereon from the date hereof at the rate of 4 1/2 per centum per annum, said interest to be paid on the 1st day of October 1950 and thereafter said interest and principal sum to be paid in installments as follows: Beginning on the 1st day of November 1950, and on the 1st day of each month thereafter the sum of \$ 23.85 to be applied on the interest and principal of said note, said payments to continue up to and including the 1st day of September, 1960, and the balance of said principal sum to be due and payable on the 1st day of October, 1960; the aforesaid monthly payments of \$ 23.85 each are to be applied first to interest at the rate of 4 1/2 per centum per annum on the principal sum of \$ 2300.00 or so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid and the balance of each monthly payment shall be applied on account of principal. Said principal and interest to be paid at the par of exchange and net to the obligee, it being thereby expressly agreed that the whole of the said principal sum shall become due after default in the payment of interest, taxes, assessments, water rate or insurance, as hereinafter provided.
