All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land with the buildings and improvements thereon situate, lying and being on the East side of McIver Street in the City of Greenville, in Greenville County, South Carolina, being shown as Lots 13, 14, 15 and a portion off the North side of Lot 12, and a portion off the South side of Lot 16, of Block B, as shown on plat of Forest Hills, made by T. C. Adams, Engineer, September 23, 1936, recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book "D", at page 206, and having according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the East side of McIver Street at joint front corner of Lots 11 and 12, and running thence through Lot 12 in an Easterly direction 193.7 feet, more or less, to a point in the rear line of Lot 12, said point being 20 feet Northeast from the joint rear corner of Lots 11 and 12; thence along the rear line of Lots 46 and 47, in a Northeasterly direction 66 feet to a stake; thence N. 25-45 W. 210 feet to an iron pin in rear line of Lot 16, corner of Smith property; thence along the Smith property N. 79-45 W. 143 feet, more or less, to a point in the front line of Lot 16 on the East side of McIver Street; thence with the East side of McIver Street, S. 6-00 W. 197.1 feet to the beginning corner.
