TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS MAY CONCERN:

I, J. T. Burdine, Jr. (hereinafter referred to as Mortgagor) SEND(S) GREETING:

WHEREAS, the Mortgagor is well and truly indebted unto FIDELITY FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION, GREENVILLE, S. C., (hereinafter referred to as Mortgagee) as evidenced by the Mortgagor's promissory note of even date herewith, the terms of which are incorporated herein by reference in the sum of Four Thousand and No/100 - - - - -

DOLLARS (\$4,000.00), with interest thereon from date at the rate of Five (5%) per centum per annum, said principal and interest to be repaid as therein stated, and

WHEREAS, the Mortgagor may hereafter become indebted to the said Mortgagee for such further sums as may be advanced to or for the Mortgagor's account for taxes, insurance premiums, public assessments, repairs, or for any other purpose:

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the Mortgagor, in consideration of the aforesaid debt, and in order to secure the payment thereof and of any other and further sums for which the Mortgagor may be indebted to the Mortgagee at any time for advances made to or for his account by the Mortgagee, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars (\$3.00) to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagee at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Mortgagee, its successors and assigns.

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, on the Western side of White Horse Road, containing 12 acres, as shown on plat made by W. A. Hester, August 28, 1943, and having according to said plat the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

"BEGINNING at an iron pin on the Western side of White Horse Road at intersection of said White Horse Road with Settlement Road, and running thence with the Northern side of Settlement Road, S. 74 W. 9.30 chs. to iron pin; thence N. 3-00 W. 6.42 chs. to iron pin; thence S. 75-2/5 W. 10.30 chs. to iron pin; thence N. 51 W. 3.22 chs. to iron pin, corner of P. W. Burdine's land; thence with line of P. W. Burdine, N. 75-2/3 E. 23.50 chs. to stone on White Horse Road; thence with the Western side of White Horse Road, S. 5 E. 8.56 chs. to the beginning corner; said land being bounded on the east by White Horse Road, on the South by land now or formerly owned by M. M. Burdine and on the North by land now or formerly owned by P. W. Burdine; said premises being the same conveyed to the mortgagor herein by deed recorded in Volume 256 at Page 264.

LESS, HOWEVER, two lots fronting on White Horse Road heretofore conveyed to Roy J. and Inez P. Henderson by deed recorded in Deed Book 484 at Page 202, and to W. L. and Janette Hunt by deed recorded in Deed Book 386 at page 517.

Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments, and appurtenances to the same belonging or in any way incident or appertaining, and all of the rents, issues, and profits which may arise or be had therefrom, and including all heating, plumbing, and lighting fixtures and any other equipment or fixtures now or hereafter attached, connected, or fitted thereto in any manner; it being the intention of the parties hereto that all such fixtures and equipment, other than the usual household furniture, be considered a part of the real estate.
