All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Paris Mountain Township,  
Greenville County, State of South Carolina, containing 42.25 acres, more  
or less, and known as Old Shockley Place, located on the Hunt Bridge  
Road, eight miles from Greenville, bounded by lands of Gibson, Bob  
Williams, Sullivan, Stokes, and having the following metes and bounds  
according to a survey and plat made by W. J. Riddle, in March, 1920:

BEGINNING at an iron pin NM and thence with the road N. 55-45 W.  
3.03 chains to pin NM; thence S. 18-15 W. 0.76 chains to stone; thence
