the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted,
bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said

All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Chick Springs Township, Greenville County,
South Carolina, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin at corner of Lot No. 7 on "A" Street, now known as Thrift
Street, and running thence North 50 feet to an iron pin; and running thence in an Easterly
direction, 150 feet, more or less, to an iron pin; thence in a Southerly direction, 50 feet
to an iron pin; thence in a Westerly direction, 150 feet, more or less, to the beginning
corner, and being Lot No. 8, according to a survey made by George Ellis, September 28, 1939.

ALSO: All that piece, parcel or lot of land in said township, County and State, adjoining
the above described lot of land, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin at corner of Lot No. 8 on "A" Street, now known as Thrift
Street, and running thence in a Northerly direction, 50 feet to an iron pin; thence in an
Easterly direction, 150 feet, more or less, to an iron pin; thence in a Southerly direction,
50 feet to an iron pin; thence in a Westerly direction, 150 feet, more or less, to an iron
pin; the beginning corner, and being known as Lot No. 9, according to a survey made by
George Ellis, September 28, 1939.
