To All Whom These Presents May Concern: I, James M. Paris,

the Mortgagor(s), SEND GREETING: hereinafter called

WHEREAS, the said Mortgagor(s) in and by his certain promissory note in writing, of even date with these Presents, is well and truly indebted to J.B. Hall

hereinafter called Mortgagee, in the full and just sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00) DOLLARS, to be paid as follows: \$15.00 on August 8, 1955, and \$15.00 on the 8th day of each month thereafter until interest and principal are paid in full

with interest thereon from date at the rate of six per centum per annum, to be computed and paid monthly as stated above until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; and in case said note should be placed in the hands of an attorney for suit or collection the Mortgagor(s) agrees to pay all costs and expenses including a reasonable amount as attorneys' fees, this to be added to the mortgage indebtedness, and to be secured under this mortgage as a part of said debt.
