

South Crowley Lateral

A 4-inch lateral of 0.67 miles in length, beginning at the outlet riser of the Gulf Interstate Meter Station, in Section 23, Township 10 South, Range 1 East, and extending northerly to tie-in to the existing South Dawson Lateral in Section 14, Township 10 South, Range 1 East, all in Acadia Parish, Louisiana.

Texas Gulf Producing Company Lateral

A 4-inch lateral of 0.69 miles in length, beginning at the outlet riser of the Texas Gulf Meter Station, in Section 27, Township 11 South, Range 1 West, and extending southerly to tie-in to the 6-inch Gueydan Lateral, in Section 34, Township 11 South, Range 1 West, all in Vermilion Parish, Louisiana.

Carolina Pipe Line Lateral

A 12-inch lateral of 0.31 miles in length, beginning at the outlet riser at Tidewater No. 2 Meter Station, on the site of Compressor Station No. 13 in Cleveland County, North Carolina, and extending southwesterly along the existing 30-inch and 36-inch Main Lines to a point of delivery to the Carolina Pipe Line Company in Cherokee County, South Carolina.

Tilden Dehydration Plant

That certain tract of land conveyed to the Company by Jas. H. Dickinson, et ux, by deed dated December 11, 1957, recorded in Vol. 66, Page 622, of the Deed Records of McMullen County, Texas, described as follows: The following described real estate situated in McMullen County, Texas, to-wit: 53.3 acres, more or less, out of the G. B. Dilworth Survey No. 24, Abstract 659, McMullen County, Texas. Said 53.3 acres is out of a 292 acre tract of land acquired by Jas. H. Dickinson from Agnes Rosser, et al, by deed dated February 1, 1929, recorded in Vol. 7, page 327 of the Deed Records of McMullen County, Texas, and said 53.3 acres is more particularly described as follows: Beginning at a point in the fenced line, which is the boundary line between Jas. H. Dickinson and Fred B. Horton (said fence line being on the eastern boundary of said Dilworth Survey, which is the western boundary of the James H. Jean Survey, Abstract 281), which said beginning point is 2576 feet northerly along said fence line from the southeast corner of said G. B.
