

Metcalf and R. C. Hayden Trustees for Edith P. Haydon by Deed dated May 19, 1894 and recorded June 13, 1895 in Book 43, page 95, Prince William County, Virginia; which 26 acre tract is more particularly described by metes and bounds, with true bearings, as follows: Beginning at a stone, the southeast corner of said Edith P. Haydon, et al 295.75 acre tract, which stone is cited in Deed of Trust from Victor Hayes Haydon to Dudley C. Cocke and W. Hill Brown, Jr. trustees, dated February 26, 1955, recorded in Deed Book 184, page 454; thence along the east boundary line of said Edith P. Haydon, et al tract N 21° 47' W a distance of 2810.30 feet to a point in the center line of Highway Route No. 621, the northeast corner of said Edith P. Haydon, et al tract, identical with the northwest corner of the Kenneth R. Aldrich, et ux tract of land; thence along the center line of said Highway Route No. 621 S 52° 26' W a distance of 106.62 feet to a spike; thence continuing along the center line of said Route No. 621 S 42° 32' W a distance of 252.75 feet to a spike for the northeast corner and the place of beginning of the 26 acre tract herein described; thence S 15° 52' E at 80.35 feet crossing the center line of Transcontinental's existing 30" line and continuing for a total distance of 1477.18 feet to a point, the southeast corner of said 26 acre tract; thence S 74° 08' W a distance of 900.00 feet to a point, the southwest corner of said 26 acre tract; thence N 15° 52' W at 661.63 feet crossing the center line of said Transcontinental's existing 30" line and continuing for a total distance of 1115.98 feet to a spike in the center line of Highway Number 621, the northwest corner of said 26 acre tract; thence along the center line of said Highway Route No. 621 as follows: N 60° 58' E 219.65 feet to a spike; N 58° 20' E. 189.72 feet to a spike; N 55° 45' E 144.78 feet to a 20d nail; N 45° 42' E 175.59 feet to a spike; N 42° 32' E 248.53 feet to the place of beginning and containing 26 acres of land more or less as shown on Transcontinental Drawing No. C-397 marked for identification "Proposed Site Compressor Station 18-A Prince William County, Virginia", thereto attached and made a part thereof.

Compressor Station No. 38—Housing Site

That certain tract of land conveyed to the Company by Victor Hayes Haydon, et al, by deed dated November 7, 1957, recorded in the Clerk's Office, Prince William County, Virginia in Deed Book 222, page 119, described as follows: All that certain tract or parcel of land, lying and being in Manassas Magisterial District, Prince William County, Virginia, containing 8.4613 acres, and bounded and described as follows: Beginning at a pipe in the south line of the State Route No. 621, which pipe is 374.39 feet east of the east property line of the land

owned by Edith Haydon, and from said point of beginning extending in an easterly direction along and fronting on the south line of said State Route No. 621 North 63° 07' 30" East 79.83 feet to a point; thence continuing in an easterly direction along said south line of State Route No. 621 in an arc to the right, which arc has a radius of 929.93 feet and a tangent of 119.81 feet, 238.32 feet to a point; thence continuing along said State Route No. 621 in an easterly direction North 77° 48' 30" East 284.93 feet to a pipe in the south line of State Route No. 621; thence extending in a southerly direction South 12° 38' 40" East 600.00 feet to a pipe; thence extending in a westerly direction South 72° 58' 10" West 600.00 feet to a pipe; thence extending in a northerly direction North 12° 38' 40" West 600.00 feet to the point and place of beginning, all as more fully shown on a plat of survey entitled "Plat of land to be acquired from Victor & Emily Haydon by Transcontinental Gas Pipe Line Corp'n.", by Ratcliffe-Secord, Certified Land Surveyors, dated October 5, 1957, a copy of which is attached thereto and made a part thereof. Compressor Station No. 38—Proposed Housing Site

That certain tract of land conveyed to the Company by C. L. Wheat, et ux, by Deed dated May 4, 1957, and recorded in Deed Book 215, page 413, Clerk's Office of the Circuit Court of Prince William County, Virginia, said tract being described as follows: All that certain tract or parcel of land, lying and being situate in Manassas Magisterial District, Prince William County, Virginia, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit: STARTING at a point on the northwest side of State Route 621, a distance of 450.12 feet from the northwest corner of Station 38, in a northeasterly direction from the point of beginning, said corner being in the center of State Route 621, and in the westerly line of a 25 foot right of way or easement; thence running S. 59° 45' W. 384.08 feet to an iron pipe driven in the ground on the northwesterly side of State Route 621; thence running N. 17° 44' 30" W. 1115.92 feet to an iron pipe driven in the ground; thence running N. 72° 15' 30" E. 375.0 feet to an iron pipe driven in the ground in the westerly boundary line of said 25 foot right of way or easement; thence running along the westerly boundary line of said 25 foot right of way or easement S. 17° 44' 30" E. 1032.74 feet to the point or place of beginning, containing 9.25 acres, more or less, as shown by Reference Drawing of Proposed Housing Site Compressor Station No. 38, Prince William County, Virginia, Drawing No. B-1497, attached thereto and made a part thereof.
