

and wife, by their Deed dated October 1, 1835, and recorded in the Office of the Recorder of Deeds, in and for York County, Pennsylvania, in Deed Book 3-T, page 307, sold and conveyed unto Samuel McLaughlin; and part of the same which Ebenezer Willson and wife, by their deed dated July 23, 1833, and recorded in said Recorder's Office, in Deed Book 3-N, page 103, sold and conveyed unto Samuel McLaughlin; and the same which Samuel McLaughlin died testate, seized thereof, on December 22, 1879, and by his last Will and Testament, dated December 9, 1879 and recorded in the Office of the Register of Wills, in and for York County, Pennsylvania, in Will Book 2-B, page 122, which provides inter alia as follows: ("4. To Samuel B. McLaughlin, all my personal) (property outside of the house and all my real estate.") The said Samuel B. McLaughlin died testate on August 10, 1908, and by his last Will and Testament dated January 4, 1898 and recorded in said Register of Wills Office, in Will Book 2-U, page 694, provided inter alia as follows: "Life estate to Mary Jane McLaughlin or during widowhood with full power to use as much thereof as may be necessary for her support and comfort. After her decease or remarriage to my six children, Elizabeth Brannon McLaughlin, Mary Priscilla McLaughlin, Sybilla Edith McLaughlin, Abraham Lincoln McLaughlin, Samuel Baer McLaughlin and William Arthur McLaughlin." The said Mary Jane McLaughlin died February 12, 1956, without converting any of the said premises. The said Samuel Baer McLaughlin died in 1912, intestate, unmarried and without issue. The said Ethel McL. Fulton is a daughter of Samuel B. McLaughlin, but was not mentioned in his Will, having been born on the 31st day of October, 1899.

York County, Pennsylvania

Compressor Station No. 39—Housing Site

That certain lot or tract of land conveyed to the Company by Irene S. Containing 6 acres and 139 perches, more or less. Being the same premises which Pearla O. Patterson by her deed dated May 15, 1945 and recorded in the Recorder of Deeds Office in and for York County, Pennsylvania, in Deed Book 31-D, page 256, granted and conveyed unto the said Irene S. Wise (Grantor herein) and Joseph A. Wise, her husband; the said Pearla O. Patterson who reserved for herself a life estate in the said deed recorded in Deed Book 31-D, page 256, died on November 13, 1953, thereby terminating the said life estate; the said Joseph A. Wise died on January 8, 1958, survived by the Grantor, his widow, who acquired the sole ownership of the said premises by virtue of her right of survivorship as a tenant by the entirety.

Compressor Station No. 47

That certain tract of land conveyed to the Company by Anthony T.
