NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the Mertgagor, in consideration of the aforesaid debt, and in order to secure the payment thereof and of any other and further sums for which the Mortgagor may be indebted to the Mortgagoe at any time for advances made to or for his account by the Mortgagoe, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars (\$3.00) to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagoe at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and released unto the Mortgagoe, its successors and assigns.

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, situate on the southwestern side of Pinckney Street, in the City of Greenville, being shown as Lot 6 on plat made by J. N. Southern, May 16, 1902, and also being shown as Lot 13, Block 1; Page 18 of the City Block Book, and being more particularly described as follows:

"HEGINNING at an iron pin on the southwestern side of Pinckney Street, about 208 feet from Butler Avenue, and running thence S. 395 W. 161 feet to an iron pin on a 16 foot alley; thence N. 445 W. 725 feet, more or less; to a pin; thence N. 395 E. 152 feet to pin on Pinckney Street; thence with the southwestern side of Pinckney Street; S. 505 E. 72 feet to the point of beginning;"
