SEND GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, I/we the aforesaid mortgagor (s) in and by my/our certain promissory note, in writing, of even date with these presents am/are well and truly indebted to FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS & LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREEN-

VILLE, in the full and just sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred Fifty & no./100 (\$2,550.00) Dollars (or for luture advances which may be made hereunder at the option of said Association, which advances shall not exceed the maximum amount stated herein and shall be evidenced by a subsequent promissory note or notes se-

cured hereby), said note to be repaid with interest at the rate specified therein in installments of
