All that piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, stuate lying and being. On the Northwestern side of Duncan Street in the City of Greenville, County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, being known and designated as Lot No. 5 as shown on a plat of a subdivision of the Estate of G.G. Wells, Deceased, and having according to a more recent plat prepared by Piedmont Engineering Service, dated September, 1958, entitled "Survey for Hemcor - McElhenney Co." recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, South Carolina, in Plat Book PP at page 193, the following metes and bounds:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the Northwestern side of Duncan Street, which iron pin is 166 feet, more or less, in a Northeasterly direction from the Northwestern corner of the intersection of Duncan Street and Hampton Avenue, and running thence N. 48-24 W. 179.3 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 27-22 E. 59.8 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 48-18 E. 177.3 feet to an iron pin on the Northwestern side of Duncan Street; thence with the Northwestern side of Duncan Street S. 25-38 W. 60 feet to the point of beginning.
