Dollars, in and by its certain promissory note in writing, of even date herewith, due and payable on or before six (6) months from the date of this mortgage, the maker reserving the right to anticipate and pay off any balance due hereunder at any time prior to maturity without penalty therefor, and on demand thereafter,

with interest from date of this Mortgage, at the rate of Five and one-half (5½%)  
percentum until paid; interest to be computed and paid Semi-Annually

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; and in case said note, after its maturity, should be placed in the hands of an attorney for suit or collection, or if before its maturity it should be deemed by the holder thereof necessary for the protection of its interests to place and the holder should place the said note or this mortgage in the hands of an attorney for any legal proceedings, then and in either of said cases the mortgagor promises to pay all costs and expenses, including ten per cent of the indebtedness as attorney's fee, this to be added to the mortgage indebtedness, and to be secured under this mortgage as a part of said debt.

Campbell, R.L.S., November 30, 1960, and recorded in the Office of the R.M.C. for Greenville County in Plat Book "QQ" at Page 169, and according to said plat having the metes and bounds following:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the western side of French Lane, joint front corners of Lots 116 and 117, and running thence S. 82-35 W. 91.4 feet to an iron pin, joint rear corner of Lots 117 and 79; running thence S. 3-18 E. 108.3 feet to an iron pin, at joint rear corner of Lots 117, 118, 78 and 79; running thence N. 72-56 E. 115.8 feet to an iron pin on the western side of French Lane the joint front corner of Lots 117 and 119, and running thence N. 17-04 W. 90 feet along the western side of French Lane to an iron pin, the point of beginning.
