	WHEREAS, I/we the aforesaid mortgagor(s) in and by my/our certain promissory note, in writing, of even date with these presents am/are well and truly indebted to FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS & LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREEN-
	VILLE, in the full and just sum of Eight Thousand. Nine Hundred and No/100 - (\$ 8,900.60) Dollars for for future advances which may be made hereunder at the option of said Association, which advances shall not exceed the maximum amount stated herein and shall be evidenced by a subsequent promissory note or notes see
	cured hereby), said note to be repaid with interest at the rate specified therein in installments of
	Sixty-Three and 77/100 (\$ 63.77 ) Dollars upon the first day of each and every calendar month hereafter in advance, until the full principal sum, with interest, has been paid, such monthly payments to be applied first to the payment of interest, computed monthly on the unpaid principal balances, and then to the payment of principal. The last payment on said note, if not paid earlier and if not subsequently
j	extended, will be due and payable 20 years after date. The note further provides that if at any time any portion of the principal or interest due thereunder shall be past due and unpaid for a period of thirty (30) days, or fatiure to comply with any of the By-Laws of said Association, or any of the stipulations of this mortgage, the whole amount due under said note, shall, at the option of the holder, become immediately due and payable, and the holder may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for ten (10%) per centum attorney's fee beside all cots and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on said note, and to be collectible as a part thereon if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney, or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage) as in and by said note, reference being thereunto had, will more fully appear.
	NOW KNOW ALL MEN, That I/we, the said mortgagor(s) in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, according to the terms of said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars to me/us the said mortgagor(s) in hand well and truly paid by the said FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, at and before the signing of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, the following described property, to-wit:

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of Jand, with all improvements thereon, or to be constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, minty of Greenville, being Lot 19 and the northwestern one-half of Lot 20 of Section B of Oak Hill Subdivision (Plat recorded in the Greenville County R. M. C. Office in Plat Book "MM", at page 81) and having, according to a plat of the property of Heyward Willimon made by J. C. Hill, October 17, 1960, the following metes and bounds:

"BEGINNING at an iron pin on the southwestern side of Oak Hill Drive at the corner of Lots 18 and 19 and running thence with the southwestern side of Oak Hill Drive, S. 44 E., 112.5 feet to an iron pin in the center of Lot 20; thence along a line bisecting Lot 20, S. 46 W., 150 feet to an iron pin in the rear line of Lot 20; thence N. 44 W., 112.5 feet to an iron pin; thence with the line of Lot 18, N. 46 E., 150 feet to the beginning corner; being the same conveyed to the mortgagors, J. J. Sparks and Margaret Sparks, by Heyward Willimon by his deed dated October 21, 1960 and recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Deed Vol. 661, at page 337, the said J. J. Sparks and Margaret Sparks having conveyed an undivided one third interest in said property to the mortgagor, Malone W. Thomason, Jr., by deed of even date, to be recorded herewith."
