"ALL that cortain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville and in the city of Greenville on the South side of Cureton Street, Being the Westerly half of lot # 7 as shown on Plat of property of Thomas T.
