Goldsmith dated March 22, 1949, recorded in Deed Book 378, at page 173 in the R.N.C. Office for Greenville County; and (2) Deed of Charleston and Western Carolina Railway Company, dated September 10, 1952, recorded in Deed Book 464 at page 333, being now one parcel of land on which the offices and service shop of Jeff Hunt Machinery Company are presently located.
