WHEREAS, I/we the aforesaid mortgagor (s) in and by my/our certain promissory note, in writing, of even date with these presents am/are well and truly indebted to FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS & LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREEN-

cured hereby), said note to be repaid with interest at the rate specified therein in installments of......

Seventy-Seven and 32/100 - - - - - - - (\$ 77.32 ) Dollars upon the first day of each and every calendar month hereafter in advance, until the full principal sum, with interest, has been paid, such monthly payments to be applied first to the payment of interest, computed monthly on the unpaid principal balances, and then to the payment of principal. The last payment on said note, if not paid earlier and if not subsequently

NOW KNOW ALL MEN, That I/we, the said mortgagor(s) in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid; and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, according to the terms of said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars to me/us the said mortgagor(s) in hand well and truly paid by the said FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN: ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, at and before the signing of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, the following described property, to-wit:

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or to be constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in Paris Mountain Township, being designated as Lot No. 17 of Section Two of a subdivision of the property of Blue Ridge Realty Co., Inc., known as "Fenwick Heights", the same as shown on a plat thereof prepared by Piedmont Engineering Service, March, 1959, said plat being recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book QQ at pages 44-45 and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

"BEGINNING at an iron pin on the southern side of Fairlawn Circle, joint front corner of Lots 17 and 18; running thence with joint line of said lots, S. 27-25 E. 156.1 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 65-54 W. 110.1 feet to an iron pin, joint rear corner of Lots 16 and 17; thence with joint line of said lots, N. 27-25 W. 149.5 feet to an iron pin on the southern side of Fairlawn Circle; thence with said street? N. 62-27 E. 110 feet to the beginning corner; being the same conveyed to me by James R. Hall by deed of even date to be recorded herewith."

In addition to the above mentioned monthly payments of principal and interest payable under the terms of the note secured hereby, the mortgagor (s) agree (s) to pay to the mortgagee on the first day of each month until the note secured by this instrument is fully paid, the following sums: a sum equal to the premiums that will next become due and payable on policies of fire and other hazard insurance covering the mortgaged property, plus taxes, and assessments next due on the mortgaged property (all as estimated by the mortgagee) less all sums already paid therefor, divided by the number of months to elapse before one month prior to the date when such premiums, taxes, and assessments will be due and payable, such sums to be held by mortgagee in escrow to pay REVISED 10-1-57 said premiums, taxes and special assessments. Should these payments exceed the amount of payments actually made by the mortgagee for taxes, assessments, or insurance premiums, the excess may be credited by the mortgagee on subsequent payments to be made by the mortgagor (s); if, however, said sums shall be insufficient to make said payments when the same shall become due and payable, the moregagor (s) shall pay to the mortgagee any amounts necessary to make up the
