To All Whom These Presents May Concern: BROOKLINE FABRICS, INC.

(herein called mortgagor) SENDS GREETING:

a corporation chartered under the laws of the State of South Carolina, is well and truly indebted

in the full and just sum of One Hundred Fifty Thousand and No/100 (\$150,000.00)

Dollars, in and by its certain promissory note in writing, of even date herewith, due and payable as follows:

One Thousand Six Hundred Sixty-Five and 30/100 (\$1,665.30) Dollars on the 14th day of JANUARY, 1966, and a like amount on the 14th day of each and every month thereafter until paid in full, payments to be applied first to interest and then to principal, the maker reserving the right to prepay any part or all of the balance due on any payment date without penalty or fee, provided any partial payment to be in accordance with the amortization schedule;

with interest from date, at the rate of six (6%) percentum until paid; interest to be computed and paid monthly

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; and in case said note, after its maturity, should be placed in the hands of an attorney for suit or collection, or if before its maturity it should be deemed by the holder thereof necessary for the protection of its interests to place and the holder should place the said note or this mortgage in the hands of an attorney for any legal proceedings, then and in either of said cases the mortgagor promises to pay all costs and expenses, including ten per cent of the indebtedness as attorney's fee, this to be added to the mortgage indebtedness, and to be secured under this mortgage as a part of said debt.
