with interest from date at the rate of seven (7%) per centum per annum until paid; interest to be computed and paid annually and if unpaid when due to bear interest at same rate as principal until paid, and I have further promised and agreed to pay ten per cent of the whole amount due for attorney's fee, if said note be collected by attorney or through legal proceedings of any kind, reference being thereunto had will more fully appear.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That I, the said James Cooley

in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof, according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to me in hand well and truly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said

Frank Ulmer Lumber Company, its successors and assigns:

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, Gantt Township, being known and designated as Lot 21 of a subdivision known as Heathwilde as shown on a preliminary plat thereof recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book QQQ at Page and having, according to a plat entitled "A Portion of Heathwilde" prepared by Campbell and Clarkson, Surveyors, May 23, 1968, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book WWW at Page 18, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the eastern edge of Canterbury Road at the joint front corner of Lots 20 and 21 and running thence along the joint line of said lots, S. 69-01 E. 191.6 feet to an iron pin on the line of Lot 26; thence along the line of that lot, N. 30-16 E. 190 feet to an iron pin at the joint rear corner of Lots 26 and 25; thence along the rear line of Lot 25, N. 20-40 E. 90.9 feet to an iron pin at a rear corner of Lot 22; thence along the line of that lot, N. 78-33 W. 245 feet to an iron pin on the eastern edge of Canterbury Road; thence along the eastern edge of Canterbury Road, S. 11-27 W. 111.4 feet to an iron pin; thence continuing along the eastern side of Canterbury Road, following the curvature thereof, the chord being S. 20-21 W. 128 feet to the beginning corner.
