MORTGAGE OF REAL ESTATE

To All Whom These Presents May Concern:

Jack E. Shaw Builders, Inc., a South Carolina corporation with its principal place of business in Greenville, S. C. (hereinafter referred to as Mortgagor) SEND(S) GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, the Mortgagor is well and truly indehted unto FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, SOUTH CAROLINA (hereinafter referred to as Mortgagee) in the full and just sum of Thirty-Seven Thousand and No/100-------(s 37,000.00)

Dollars, as evidenced by Mortgagor's promissory note of even date herewith, said note to be repoid with interest at the rate therein specified in installments of Two Hundred Seventy-Nine and 48/100--- (\$ 279, 48) Dollars each on the first day of each month hereafter, in advance, until the principal sum with interest has been paid in full, such payments to be applied first to the payment of interest, computed monthly on unpaid principal balances, and then to the payment of principal with the last payment, if not sooner paid, to be due and payable. 29 years after date; and

WHEREAS, said note further provides that if at any time any portion of the principal or interest due thereunder shall be past due and unpaid for a period of thirty days, or if there shall be any failure to comply with and abide by any By-Laws or the Charter of the Mortgage, or any slipulations set out in this mortgage, the whole amount due thereunder shall, at the option of the holder thereunder become immediately due and payable, and said holder shall have the right to intelled any procedings upon said note and any collaterals given to secure same, for the purpose of collecting said principal due, and interest, with costs and expenses for such moveedines; and

WHEREAS, the Mortgagor may hereafter become indebted to the Mortgagee for such further sums as may be advanced to the Mortgagor's account for the payment of taxes, insurance premiums, repairs, or for any other purpose;

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN. That the Mortgagor, in consideration of said debt and to secure the payment thereof and any further sums which may be advanced by the Mortgage to the Mortgagor's account, and itso in consideration of the sum of Three Dollans (33.00) to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgage at and before the scaling of these presents, the receipt whereof is firerely acknowledged, has granted, bargainet, sold, and released, and by the presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Mortgagee, its successors and assigns, the following described real estate:

All that certain piece, parcel, or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter to be constructed thereon, situate, bying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, being known and designated as Lot No. 362 of a subdivision entitled "Revision of Sector VI, Botany Woods" according to a plat thereof prepared by Piedmont Engineering Service April 15, 1963 and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book YY at Page 131, and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the northern side of Bonaventure Drive at the joint front corner of Lots Nos. 363 and 362, and running thence with the joint line of said lots, N. 11-17 W. 223.9 feet to an iron pin, the joint rear corner of Lots 363 and 362; thence with the rear line of Lot 362, N. 87-18 E. 193.1 feet to an iron pin at the joint rear corner of Lots Nos. 362 and 283; thence with the joint line of said lots, S. 2-27 E. 205 feet to an iron pin on the northern side of said Bonaventure Drive, joint front corner of Lots Nos. 283 and 362; thence with the northern side of said Bonaventure Drive, S. 84-15 W. 100 feet to an iron pin, and S. 76-22 W. 60 feet to the point of beginning; being the same conveyed to the mortgagor corporation by Botany Woods, Inc. by deed recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Vol. 805, at Page 428.

The Mortgagor's promissory note referred to above, contains, among other things, a provision for an increase in the interest rate.
