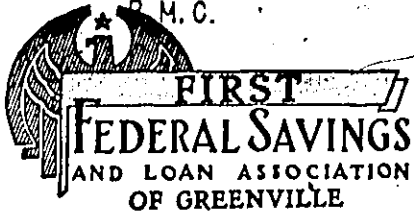

MORTGAGE OF REAL ESTATE

To All Whom These Presents May Concern:

We, Jimmie Lee Bowman and Lorraine S. Bowman, of Greenville County

(hereinafter referred to as Mortgagor) SEND(S) GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, the Mortgagor is well and truly indebted unto FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, SOUTH CAROLINA (hereinafter referred to as Mortgagee) in the full and just sum of

Sixteen Thousand Six Hundred Fifty and No/100-----(\$ 16,650.00) Dollars, as evidenced by Mortgagor's promissory note of even date herewith, said note to be repaid with interest at the rate

therein specified in installments of One Hundred Twenty-Eight and 53/100-----\$ 128.53) Dollars each on the first day of each month hereafter, in advance, until the principal sum with interest has been paid in full, such payments to be applied first to the payment of interest, computed monthly on unpaid principal balances, and then to the payment of principal with the last payment, if not sooner paid, to be due and payable 25 years after date; and

WHEREAS, said note further provides that if at any time any portion of the principal or interest due thereunder shall be past due and unpaid for a period of thirty days, or if there shall be any failure to comply with and abide by any By-Laws or the Charter of the Mortgagee, or any stipulations set out in this mortgage, the whole amount due thereunder shall, at the option of the holder thereof become immediately due and payable, and said holder shall have the right to institute any proceedings upon said note and any collaterals given to secure same, for the purpose of collecting said principal due, and interest, with costs and expenses for such proceedings; and

WHEREAS, the Mortgagor may hereafter become indebted to the Mortgagee for such further sums as may be advanced to the Mortgagor's account for the payment of taxes, insurance premiums, repairs, or for any other purpose:

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the Mortgagor, in consideration of said debt and to secure the payment thereof and any further sums which may be advanced by the Mortgagee to the Mortgagor's account, and also in consideration of the sum of Three Dollars (\$3.00) to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagee at and before the sealing of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Mortgagee, its successors and assigns, the following described real estate:

All that certain piece, parcel, or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter to be constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, being known and designated as Lot 44 of a subdivision known as Coral Ridge, according to a plat prepared by Piedmont Engineering Service, dated March 1963, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book XX at Page 119, and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

"BEGINNING at an iron pin on the southern side of Walker Springs Road, joint front corner Lots 44 and 45, running thence along the line of these lots, S. 7-05 W. 179.1 feet to an iron pin in the line of Lot 43; running thence N. 83-48 W. 90.3 feet to an iron pin on the eastern side of Hastings Circle; thence along the eastern side of Hastings Circle, N. 8-20 E. 154.6 feet to an iron pin at an intersection, which intersection is curved, the chord of which is N. 52-30 E. 35.9 feet to an iron pin on the southern side of Walker Springs Road; thence along the southern side of Walker Springs Road, S: 83-20 E. 61.6 feet to an iron pin, point of beginning; being the same conveyed to us by David C. Burdge by deed of even date to be recorded herewith."

The mortgagors' promissory note referred to above, contains, among other things, a provision for an increase in the interest rate.

LESS, HOWEVER, that property taken by the South Carolina State Highway Department through condemnation being described in the Notice of Condemnation dated January 15, 1970 and described as follows: "All that parcel or strip of land within 28 feet of the center line of the survey on the left, between approximate survey stations 12#82 and 13#64; being bounded by lands of Robert C. Spake, et al. on the east, by other lands of David C. Burdge on the South, by Hastings Circle on the west and by Road S-622 on the North.
