All that piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, being a portion of that piece, parcel or lot of land as shown on plat by Enwright Associates, dated March 13, 1972, and recorded in the Office of the R.M.C. in Plat Book 4 J, at page 159, with all the improvements which have been constructed upon said portion, the metes and bounds of which portion of land are as follows:

Beginning at an iron pin which is N. 34-16 E. 167.3 feet from a hole in the top of culvert on the Southeasterly edge of the right-of-way of Range View Drive and running thence N. 38-36 E. 178.8 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 39-36 E. 156.6 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 50-24 W. 175 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 39-36 W. 150.6 feet to an iron pin, being the place of beginning.
