BEGINNING at a point in the center of Neely Ferry Road at the intersection of Neely Ferry Road and Knickerbocker Road and continuing down the center of said Knickerbocker Road in an easterly direction 1274 feet, more or less, to a point; thence in a southerly direction 769 feet, more or less, to a point; thence in an easterly direction 1439 feet, more or less, to a point in the center of Rabun Creek; thence with the center of Rabun Creek as the line in a northerly direction to an iron pin across Knickerbocker road, which pin is located in the center of said creek at the joint corner of property of the grantor herein and property now or formerly of James L. and Louise L. Woods; thence in a westerly direction 2,401 feet, more or less, to a point in the center of Neely Ferry Road; thence in a southerly direction down the center of Neely Ferry Road 381.4 feet, more or less, to the point of BEGINNING.
