9. That, together with, and in addition to, the payments of principal and interest payable under the terms of the note secured hereby, the Mortgagor will pay to the Mortgagee, at the Mortgagee's option, on such payment date, until the indebtedness secured hereby is paid in full, a proportionate sum of the annual taxes, public assessments and applicable insurance premiums, as estimated by the Mortgagee. All such deposits shall be held by the Mortgagee without interest and free of any lien or claim of the Mortgagor's creditors, to be used by the Mortgagee to pay such taxes, assessments and premiums as the same become due and payable.

10. That the Mortgagor hereby assigns all the rents, issues, and profits of the mortgaged premises and should legal proceedings be instituted pursuant to this instrument, then the Mortgagee shall have the right to have a receiver appointed of the rents, issues and profits, who, after deducting all charges and expenses attending such proceedings shall apply the residue of the rents, issues and profits toward the payment of the debt secured hereby.

11. That the Mortgagor will not, without first obtaining the written consent of the Mortgagee, mortgage or encumber the mortgaged premises or assign or attempt to assign the rents or any part thereof from the said premises.

12. That the Mortgagor will keep Mortgagor's books and records in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles covering the operation of the premises, should the same be income producing, and, on demand of the Mortgagee, deliver to the Mortgagee, within ninety (90) days after the close of each of the Mortgagor's fiscal years, an annual statement of operations for the premises for the preceding fiscal year, prepared and certified by an independent public accountant acceptable to the Mortgagee.

13. That the Mortgagee shall have the right to enter and inspect the mortgaged premises at all reasonable times.

14. That the enactment of any new statute or law by any governmental agency or body, or the legal interpretation of any existing statute or law, that in the judgment of the Mortgagee materially interferes with the mortgaged premises or

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
