To have and to hold unto Lender and Lender's successors and assigns, forever; together with all the improvements now or hereafter erected on the (State and Zip Code) property, and all fixtures now or hereafter attached to the property, all of which including replacements and additions thereto, shall be deemed to be and remain in a part of the property covered by this Mortgage, and all of the foregoing, together with said property are herein referred to as the "Property".

Borrower and Lender covenant and agree as follows:

1. Payment of Principal and Interest. Borrower shall promptly pay when due the principal of and interest on the indebtedness evidenced by the Note. prepayment and late charges as provided in the Note.

2. Insurance, Borrower shall keep all improvements on said land, now or hereafter erected, constantly insured for the benefit of the Lender against loss by fire, windstorm and such other casualties and contingencies, in such manner and in such companies and for such amounts, not exceeding that amount necessary to pay the sum secured by this Mortgage, and as may be satisfactory to the Lender. Borrower shall purchase such insurance, pay all premiums therefor, and shall deliver to I ender such policies along with evidence of premium payment as long as the note secured hereby remains unpaid. If Borrower fails to purchase such insurance, pay the premiums therefor or deliver said policies along with evidence of payment of premiums thereon, then Lender, at his option, may purchase such insurance. Such amounts paid by Lender shall be added to the Note secured by this Mortgage, and shall be due and payable upon exmand by Borrower to Lender.

3. Taxes, Assessments, Charges. Borrower shall pay all taxes, assessments and charges as may be lawfully levied against the Property within thirty (30) days after the same shall become due. In the event that Borrower fails to pay all taxes, assessments and charges as herein required, then Lender at his option, may pay the same and the amounts paid shall be added to the Note secured by this Mortgage, and shall be due and payable upon demand by Borrower to

4. Preservation and Maintenance of Property. Borrower shall keep the Property in good repair and shall not commit waste or permit impairment or Lender. deterioration of the Property

5. Transfer of the Property: Due on Sale. If the Borrower sells or transfers all or part of the Property or any rights in the Property, any person to whom the Borrower sells or transfers the Property may take over all of the Borrower's rights and obligations under this Mortgage (known as an "assumption of the Mortgage") if certain conditions are met. Those conditions are

(A.) Borrower gives Lender notice of sale or transfer,

(B) Lender agrees that the person qualifies under its then usual credit criteria;

(C) The person agrees to pay interest on the amount owed to Lender under the Note and under this Mortgage at whatever rate Lender requires; and

(D.) The person signs an assumption agreement that is acceptable to Lender and that obligates the person to keep all of the promises and agreements made in the Note and in this Mortgage.

If the Borrower sells or transfers, the Property and the conditions in A. B. C and D of this section are not satisfied. Lender may require immediate payment in full of the Note, foreclose the Mortgage, and seek any other remedy allowed by the law. However, I ender will not have the right to require immediate payment in full or any other legal remedy as a result of certain transfers. Those transfers are

(i) the creation of liens or other claims against the Property that are inferior to this Mortgage, such as other mortgages, materialman's liens, etc.;

a transfer of rights in household appliances, to a person who provides the Borrower with the money to buy these appliances, in order to protect

that person against possible losses:

(iii) a transfer of the Property to surviving co-owners, following the death of a co-owner, when the transfer is automatic according to law; and

(iv) leasing the Property for a term of three (3) years or less, as long as the lease does not include an option to buy.

6. Warranties. Borrower covenants with Lender that he is seized of the Property in fee simple, has the right to convey the same in fee simple, that title is marketable and free and clear of all incumbrances, and that he will warrant and defend the title against the lawful claims of all persons whomsoever, except for the exceptions hereinafter stated.
